Notification of the Ministry of Public Health No. 98 (B.E.2529)

Re : Prescribing standards of Contaminated Substances.

By virtue of section 5 and section 6(3) of the Food Act (B.E.2522), the Minister of Public Health hereby notifies that,

No. 1 Notification of MPH No.80 (B.E.2527) Re : Prescribing Standards of Contaminated Substances dated 17th February 2527, is hereby cancelled.

No. 2 Food contain contaminated substance which is manufactured or imported for distribution, or that have for sale, shall be food prescribing standards.

No. 3 Contaminated substances mean substances which are contaminated with foods unintentionally, but resulted from manufacturing process, method of manufacturing, factory or sites of manufacturing, storing, transportation, keeping or the contamination from environment including of particles from insects, animals or other foreign matter.

No. 4 Food contain contaminated substance must contain standard to be found contaminated substance not more than as specified as following.

(1) Metals ;

(a)	Tin	250 mg.	per	1	Kilogram of food
(b)	Zinc	100 mg.	"	1	" "
(c)	Copper	20 mg.	"	1	" "
(d)	Lead	1 mg.	"	1	" "

Unless the foods contain high amount of natural contaminated lead shall be followed by FDA approval.

(e)	Arsenic	2 mg.	per	1	Kilogram of foods
(f)	Mercury	0.5 mg.	"	1	" "

and not more than 0.02 mg. " 1 " for other foods

(2) A-flatoxin 20 mcg. per 1 Kilogram of foods

(3) Other contaminated substance shall be followed by FDA approval.

No. 5 This Notification shall not enforce the foods manufactured or imported for distribution nor to the foods which have been prescribed by MPH Notification as specially controlled foods, or foods which are quality or standards specified and that Notification has specifically prescribed the quantity of contaminated substances or else prescribed.

This Notification shall be enforce since the date after its publication in the government gazette.
